

VILLAGE OF PORT CLEMENTS

BY-LAW NO. 51

A by-law to authorize the borrowing for the estimated cost of constructing a Sewerage Disposal System for the Village of Port Clements.

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable and expedient to construct a Sewerage Disposal System to service the Village of Port Clements.

AND WHEREAS the estimated cost of constructing a sewerage disposal system including expenses incidental thereto is the sum of \$1,076,597.00 which is the amount of debt intended to be created by this by-law.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the assessed value for general municipal purposes of the taxable land and improvements for the current year and for each of the two years immediately preceding the current year were:

1975 -
1976 - 671,994
1977 - 798,052

AND WHEREAS the amount of the authorized debenture debt of the municipality is \$35,040 of which \$1,111. is existing outstanding debenture debt and \$NIL is authorized and unissued debenture debt, and none of the principal or interest of the debenture debt of the municipality is in arrears.

AND WHEREAS the approval of the Provincial Health Officer has been obtained.

AND WHEREAS a provisional certificate of the Minister of Lands, Forests and Water Resources has been obtained under the provisions of the Pollution Control Act.

AND WHEREAS the maximum term for which debentures may be issued secure the debt created by this by-law is 25 years.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Village of Port Clements assembled enacts as follows:

1. The Council is hereby empowered and authorized to undertake and carry out or cause to be carried out the construction of sewerage disposal system generally in accordance with general plans approved by the Provincial Health Officer and to do all things necessary in connection therewith and without limiting the generality of the foregoing -

(1) To borrow upon the credit of the municipality a sum not exceeding \$1,076,597.00.

(2) To acquire all such real property, easements, rights or authorities that may be requisite or desirable for or in connection with the construction of the said water distribution system.

2. This by-law may be cited as "Sewerage Disposal System Loan Authorization By-law No. 51, 1977."



ALCOHOLISM TREATMENT PLANNING MEETING CALLED

During the past year, the problem of alcoholism and drug abuse has been widely discussed in various communities on the Queen Charlotte Islands. AA and Alanon groups meeting regularly in Queen Charlotte City and Juskaia alcoholism programs are beginning to happen in Haida and Skidegate; and, a joint CFS/Masset/Haida Alcoholism committee that has been meeting for several months has opened a Friendship Centre in the B.C. Packers trailer.

But, still we are faced with the situation of having to send our residents off island to treatment facilities, which is not only costly, but an incomplete solution to the problem. The individual is removed from his/her family and community and then has to face the problems of readjustment after returning.

Our proposal is to apply for funding from the Alcohol and Drug Commission for a detox and/or treatment facility on the Charlottes. We have been discussing the formation of a Society that would be capable of administering such a project.

Applications for funding must be submitted to the Alcohol and Drug Commission by October 1st, 1977. A planning meeting will be held on: FRIDAY, JULY 8TH - 9:00 A.M. - H & HR MEETING ROOM.

NEW SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT APPOINTED

Last week, the School Board administration said "Bon Voyage" to Al MacMillan, our District School Superintendent who moves to Smithers District this summer. A welcome is extended to Nick Keis who comes here from Abbotsford to replace Mr. MacMillan as School Supt. and who plans to live in Queen Charlotte City. Mr. Keis will move in about the middle of this month.

Currently the Dept. of Education is considering a request by School Board Chairman Duane Gould for separation of this District 50 from District 92 (Nisga) in terms of supervision. If approved this would allow Mr. Keis to devote all his time to the Queen Charlotte School District. Mr. MacMillan's time as School Supt. was allocated approximately 1/3 to Nisga School District and 2/3 to Queen Charlotte District.

SOME EDUCATION STATISTICS

The June edition of the Ministry of Education's publication "EDUCATION TODAY" tells us that the mill rate for this school district is 48.899 - that the Assessed value per pupil works out to \$16,036 and - that the district receives special aid in the amount of \$225,000 which together with an adjustment for last year brings the special aid total to \$278,901. And if you want to compare the operating cost per pupil in this district with those in other school districts, here are one or two examples.


District 50 cost per pupil is \$277, Vancouver shows \$1,695, New Westminster - \$1,746, Prince Rupert - \$1,601, Nisga - \$3,645

Still on statistics, for the pupil to teacher ratio last fall, the Islands ratio was 16.11, Vancouver - 19.35, New Westminster - 17.83, Prince Rupert - 18.66 and Nisga 14.19, and for one final comparison, that of average class size:

Elementary class size in this district last fall was 19.7, Secondary class size was 18.1, & highest class sizes in the province are around the 26 mark.
